## Teacher's Corner A message from the teacher:

## Class Curriculum

In **writing workshop**, the children will continue writing "small moment" stories. They will be learning how to make their writing easy to read so that other people can read their stories. We will focus on neat writing on the lines, spelling sight words correctly, listening for all the sounds in words, and putting spaces between our words, among other skills. Students will begin to reread their writing to revise and edit.

In **reading workshop**, students will be learning to read "just-right" books by themselves. They will develop strategies for figuring out words in their books independently. Students will also be working on setting goals for themselves as readers.

In **math** we will be working on graphing. Children will learn to read and create concrete graphs with real objects, picture graphs, and bar graphs. We will learn how graphs are useful for answering questions, taking surveys, and comparing quantity.

In **social studies** our class will join the school in an integrated unit on China. We will begin by learning about the globe, continents, and oceans. After identifying our own continent and our neighbors on it, we will learn about the continent of Asia and focus on China. The whole school will be learning about Chinese New Year in partnership with the music classes!

In **science**, the students will begin studying wood and paper. We will learn the properties and uses of these helpful materials, identify types of wood and paper, and search for objects made from them. Students will experiment how water affects wood and how paper can be changed. The concepts of recycling and trees as natural resources will be introduced.

The children have begun **LEAP**. During the holidays take some time to ask them about the different activities they are engaged in.
